- 1) Welcome, new committee members
- 2) Adoption of February 9, 2024 minutes Minutes will be adopted with corrections. Item 4 on the February 9 minutes stated the CPH sponsored resolution would require the retirement of licenses. Dr. Jeffrey Selzer corrected that statement to say that there is a resolution related to the option to retire licenses and that he would research what the trajectory was. The purpose of the resolution is to retire the license, without discipline, of a physician who has cognitive impairments.
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> 3) 2024 HOD Resolution 160: MSSNY Opposition to the Legalization of Non-prescription Drugs – Pat Clancy noted that the committee had sunset previous policies dealing with hallucinogens. Ms. Clancy also remarked that the reference committee stated there needed to be more discussion with regards to decriminalization, so it has been referred back to the Council. MSSNY Council has not yet referred it back to the committee but it is expected to be in June. As such, it will be placed on the agenda for the November committee meeting, then to the MSSNY Council for approval. Ms. Clancy also suggested putting together a small subcommittee to formulate a

- policy. She will send out an email to gauge interest in joining thesubcommittee.
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4) DEA: To reclassify marijuana from Class I to Class III

Schedule https://apnews.com/article/marijuana-biden-dea-23 24 criminal-justice-pot-f833a8dae6ceb31a8658a5d65832a3b8 - Pat Clancy remarked that that MSSNY has traditionally supported moving 25 26 marijuana from a Schedule 1 drug to a Schedule 3 drug, as well as the AMA. Dr. Russell Kamer noted that marijuana does not meet the criteria for an FDA 27 approved medicine and that there is a difference between medical 28 29 cannabinoids and marijuana. Dr. Gregory Bunt elaborated further, stating that there has been a recommendation that cannabis be rescheduled to a 30 different category altogether, separate from a legitimate medication. Dr. 31 Richard Blum noted that many other FDA approved drugs come from plants 32 and there is no reason marijuana can't be made as a medicine. He also noted 33 that current research is taking place on THC and that the non-psychoactive 34 portions of the plant would be used medically. Dr. Jeffrey Selzer remarked 35 that the Department of Health is not in charge of the medical aspect of 36 marijuana, that it is the cannabis board that is in charge. Dr. Tom Lee 37 highlighted that medical marijuana has a more defined structure vs. 38 recreation marijuana. Ms. Clancy noted that the AMA has a cannabis 39 40 taskforce and that she will check with them to see what their process will be regarding the rescheduling of marijuana. 41 42
