- 1) Welcome, new vice chair and new members
- 2) Adoption of February 2, 2024 minutes approved

3) Organ Donation Presentation: Nancey P. Agard, RN, MS, Director, Bureau of Organ Donation and Transplantation, New York State Department of Health, Division of Hospitals and Diagnostic and Treatment Centers, Office of Primary Care and Health Systems Management – Nancey Agard provided insight on the New York State Donate Life Registry, of which the DMV is currently the largest registration source. She also discussed the responsibilities of the Organ Procurement Organization (OPO), as well as organ allocation rules, living donation and the current status of organ donation in New York State. This led to a discussion from the committee, exploring topics such as the ethical considerations of organ donation, the length of the organ donation waitlist and the impact of proposed federal changes to OPO.

4) 2024 House of Delegates Action

- a) Principles of Public Health The 2024 HOD adopted this resolution as MSSNY policy.
- **b) Medical Aid in Dying** Dr. Stanley Bukowski expressed his disapproval that MSSNY, as noted by Pat Clancy, has shifted it's position from supporting previous assisted suicide policy, to supporting

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24 25 the Medical Aid in Dying act. It was remarked that physicians should continue to retain their choice to opt in or out of any processes and procedures outlined in any medical aid in dying legislation. The reference committee during the House of Delegates meeting in May fully supported this. Dr. Joel Potash expressed concerns over hospice accessibility as well as the ability of certain populations to fully consent to be administered the drugs that would end their lives. Dr. Jeffrey Berger also expressed his concerns over the impact of medical aid in dying on marginalized populations in New York State. Dr. Dan Nicoll raised concern over safe and effective means for the euthanasia drugs, immunity from lawsuits and potential coercion issues. He also discussed the implications of using EMtala to enforce institutional compliance with medical aid in dying.

5) Topics for next meeting – The committee discussed adding topics such as organ donation, compassionate exception for prescription drugs, interstate transportation of abortion pills and gender-affirming surgery for minors to the agenda for the next meeting
