MCMS Member Advocacy Efforts

- The Lifetime Care Companies: announcement of merger with CDPHP. MCMS is working with MSSNY leadership to schedule in-person meeting. Dr. Janine Fogarty, new MCMS President has written a position statement which has been sent to MCMS membership and has been posted on our website.
- Excellus BCBS 2025 Proposed Premium Increase: MCMS has been advocating against these increases of 24-26% that will severely impact private practices.

- MCMS Community Health Collaborative (CHC) met with key community stakeholders in mid-April 2024. A new Chair of this important committee was voted in at the June 18, 2024, MCMS Board of Directors meeting.
