- 1. Welcome, welcome to committee members; review of committee list
- 2. Adoption of January 26, 2024 minutes approved
- 3. MSSNY House of Delegates 2024 meeting:
 - a) Resolution 170: Addressing the Historical Injustices of Anatomical Specimen Use amended resolution adopted. Dr. Mauvareen Beverley asked for clarification on the terminology of brown people. Dr. Adolph Meyer remarked that his opinion was that brown people covered people from the Indian subcontinent as well as people of Middle Eastern descent. Dr. Cohen remarked that, in the context of South African apartheid; that black and brown people were in different categories. Dr. Vilma Joseph stated that more relaxed, colloquial language allows for the use of black and brown categorizations. Dr. Louis Auguste remarked that the media tends to put a lot of Hispanic/Latino people into the brown category.

b) Resolution 172: Guiding Principles for the Healthcare of Migrants adopted

- **4. HEBD Concept Paper** Dr. Joseph introduced the Health Equity by Design paper which has the goal of reducing healthcare disparities with the utilization of technology through the Federal Government. Dr. Joseph spoke of various ways technology could be used to reduce healthcare disparities, such as ensuring patients had access to the proper language services. Dr. Jsoeph remarked that the government is asking for ideas to advance health equity using electronic health records. Pat Clancy recommends that the committee work on the questions presented in the paper, and that Dr. Joseph should reach out to AMA's Health Equity office to see if they have started the process already.
- **5. Development of CME Program** Dr. Mauvareen Beverly is working on a CME program for patient engagement and cultural competency. Pat Clancy noted that an application for accreditation is needed, and that she will have a discussion with Drs Joseph and Beverly about the educational objectives and all that is required, with the goal of being ready for the June CME committee meeting.
- **6. National Medicine Association Annual Convention** The National Medical Association is having their annual conference in Manhattan August 3rd-7th. Dr. Meyer encouraged committee members to attend.
- **7. DEI Award** Dr. Joseph asked the committee for nominees for the Dr. Anthony Clemendor award, usually presented at the House of Delegates. In previous years, a survey was sent to committee members so that they may submit their nominations.
