- 2) Adoption of January 25, 2024, Minutes approved 4
 - 3) 2024 House of Delegates—Principles of Public Health During an **Infectious Disease Outbreak** – The HOD accepted this resolution and it is now policy

9 Vaccine Equity Discussion – Dr. William Valenti and Dr. Phil Kaplan introduced a discussion stating that vaccine purchase has become a problem, 10 particularly evident due to the privatization of the Covid vaccine. Dr. Kaplan 11 noted that there is vaccine wastage, particularly among the minority vaccine 12 purchase group. Per Dr. Kaplan, the Academy of Family Physician's 13 14 recommends public purchase of all vaccines except for the tetanus vaccine. Pat Clancy verifies MSSNY's support of the public purchase of vaccines, 15 noting that the Department of Health in previous years was also in support 16 but it was determined to not be fiscally feasible. Dr. Kaplan and Pat Clancy 17 will procure a white paper from the Department of Health to assist with 18 developing a more tangible and fiscally viable policy in regard to reducing 19 vaccine wastage and the public purchase of vaccines. Pat Clancy will put this 20 on the agenda for the next committee meeting.

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23 5) NYS HCV Testing Law Requirement to require the offer of an HCV screening test to all adults and persons under 18 years of age with 24 an identified risk--Colleen Flanigan, RN, MS, Director, Bureau of 25 Hepatitis Health Care and Epidemiology, New York State Department 26

- 27 of Health – Colleen Flanagan highlighted universal screening recommendations for Hep C, with an implementation date set for May 3 to 28 achieve elimination goals by 2030 in New York State. Provider reporting 29 obligations under public health law were stressed for monitoring progress 30 effectively. Brianna Norton discussed advancements in Hep C treatment, 31 32 highlighting direct-acting antivirals' high cure rates. Her presentation emphasized the importance of adherence for successful outcomes, along with 33 34 simplifying dosing regimens, and introducing universal screening among adults and pregnant individuals to help curb rising Hep C infections. Various 35 elimination options were discussed, including enhanced testing protocols, 36 timely diagnosis and treatment among Hep C susceptible individuals and 37 advanced treatment options. Dr. Valenti will do a podcast with Colleen 38 Flannigan and Brianna Norton for further discussion on this topic. 39
