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1. Welcome New Committee Members

Dr. Donald Moore began the meeting by welcoming everyone and introducing himself, followed by the rest of the committee members.

2. Approval of the October 20, 2023 Meeting Minutes

There was unanimous approval of the October 2023 meeting minutes.

3. Peer to Peer and Women Physicians Leadership Academy

Ms. Rento gave an update on the Peer to Peer program. Since MSSNY began offering this program, there has been a total of 26 reach-ins from physicians, residents, and medical students. Since the last physician wellness meeting, there was a peer training session for 28 students at NYITCOM. Ms. Clancy mentioned that a future peer training session has not been scheduled yet. She also mentioned that the P2P program is seeking grant funding for enhanced marketing. Dr. Selzer mentioned that he recommends an increase in promotion of the program. Other committee members agreed that this program is very beneficial and needs to be utilized more frequently. A motion was made to increase the marketing and promotion of the P2P program, all committee members were in favor of the motion.

Ms. Rento gave a summary of the Women Physicians Leadership Academy, a
series of 6 educational webinars for physicians, residents, and medical
students. Participants can earn up to 18 CME credits, and all sessions are

now available on the MSSNY CME website. Ms. Clancy mentioned that the WPLA will hopefully continue in the Fall of this year.

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4. Senior Section Committee of the AMA

Dr. Steven Mandel mentioned that New York State is one of the few states that does not have a senior section. He has spoken to other physicians, and they are interested in establishing a group for senior physicians, retired physicians, or semi-retired physicians who are facing issues. He asked the committee members for support regarding establishing a connection for senior physicians.

Dr. Mandel spoke about physician substance use disorder and mentioned that he participated in 2 programs this past year that had over a thousand registrants. These programs focused on addiction, addiction in the workplace, and physician addiction. Dr. Mandel also informed the committee of a program he put together with ACOM on environmental medicine. If any committee members would like to sign up, the link was included in the MediaFire.

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5. Committee Discussion on Future PW Issues

Dr. Brian White mentioned the importance of focusing the structural issues, for example what is causing physicians to become burnt out. He recommends this topic to stay on the PW agenda. He also informed the committee of the idea of a special interest group, something that is beneficial to physicians mental health and wellness. Dr. Selzer recommended, for a future meeting, that the committee discusses advocating for the data on physician engagement and burnout be public and advertised.
