- 1) Welcome new committee members
- 2) Adoption of Feb 7, 2024 minutes approved

3) 2024 HOD Resolution 165 – Public Safety Agencies Data Collection Enhancement – Pat Clancy discussed MSSNY would work with the National Emergency Medical Services Information System to promote a listing of necessary data points, as well as working with other groups and encouraging the state legislature to mandate collections of the data. This resolution, which was approved by MSSNY HOD, will be forwarded to the AMA. Dr. Milnecker will be leading the charge on this resolution.

- 4) 2024 HOD Resolution 166 Principles of Public Health During an Infectious Disease Outbreak The House of Delegates meeting in April resulted in minor wording changes being made to the resolution but the virtual reference committee approved this resolution and it is now policy.
- **5) Update on 24-25 New York State Budget** Morris Auster presented a slideshow, highlighting the successes and challenges MSSNY has had, particularly in defeating adverse proposals, highlighting the efforts of Dr. Lee and Dr. Lopresto. Mr. Auster noted the work Zina Cary did in conjunction

with the New York State Psychiatric Association in on the law that requires health insures to pay for telehealth services at a level comparable to in person services. He also spoke of the new investment New York State is making in the patient centered medical home program, remarking that the plan from the health department is to increase the per member per month payments by \$2 per month. Also noted was the continuation of the expanded Mew York State Medical Student Loan repayment program, which was increased by 75% over the past years. Mr. Auster then spoke of MSSNY's Committee for Physician's Health, which had been proposed to be eliminated but ultimately, was restored. Mr. Auster thanked everyone for their efforts to keep that program. He also noted that there had been a proposal regarding the excess medical malpractice insurance program, which was restored by the legislature. There was also a proposal that would have prohibited out of network physicians with Medicaid managed care plans from appealing dispute payments to New York state's dispute resolution system. Mr. Auster highlighted the efforts that were made to attempt to restore that. Mr. Auster also noted the scope of practice for physician assistants, which was proposed to be expanded, was taken out. He also remarked on was part of a package that would prohibit hospitals from filing lawsuits against patients who make less than 400% of the federal poverty level. Also contained within that package was an item that requires additional consent for payment that is distinct from treatment. It was noted that additional guidance is needed from the health department. Lastly, Mr. Auster spoke of new provisions that will require additional notices going to patients when they use their credit card for medical payments, which also requires additional information from the health department.

6) Funding Projects for ABMS – Dr. Clare Bradley noted that while the committee has moved to implement the ABMS CME program, the areas that need work before implementation are funding and content. Pat Clancy and Miriam Hardin spoke with Dr. Patricia Gagliano regarding topics that would be suited for such a program. Dr. Gagliano shared a document that listed potential topics for the ABMS program, including chronic kidney disease, vaccinations, substance use disorders and Artificial Intelligence. Ms. Clancy recommended that the committee prioritize topics that would be helpful and then potential funding avenues could be explored. Dr. Bradley expressed her desire for a committee to be formed and she nominated Dr. Gagliano to sit on said committee, along with Pat Clancy and Miriam Hardin.
